Information on Brexit in English

Dear Sir or Madam,

The United Kingdom will leave the European Union according to the current timetable soon. It is still not known whether there will be a no-deal or a deal scenario.

In order to ensure an efficient handling of the process for UK residents, The Munich Foreigners' Office is fully prepared for all possible eventualities.

What does a no-deal mean for you?

In a no-deal scenario, you will need a residency title for Germany. There will be a transition period of 3 months, starting on 13th April 2019. During this transition period you can continue working and living in Germany as before. However, you will have to make an appointment with the Foreigners' Office <u>from 15th April 2019 onwards</u>.

Furthermore, there is a link to book an appointment from 15th April 2019 onwards. Alternatively, you can make an appointment via our telephone number 233-96010.

<u>Please note: it is not possible to book an appointment before 15th April 2019, neither online nor via phone.</u>

During the appointment, we will discuss which residency title you are eligible for. Also, you will receive a certificate, which proves that you can work in Germany and that you are a legitimate resident.

On our homepage, you can also find information about the possibilities to acquire German citizenship.

What does a deal mean for you?

You do not need an appointment for now. In this case, please check the latest status via our homepage.

What does Brexit mean for your UK driving licence?

In the event of a no-deal scenario your UK driving licence may no longer be valid in Germany as of 13th April 2019. If you hold a UK driving licence, you should apply for an exchange to a German driving licence before 13th April 2019 at the
